

What is DDP?

The Drinking Driver Program (DDP) is a 7 week education program that covers many aspects of the traffic system and drinking and driving. Classes Typically last 2-2½ hours.

What should I expect?

Taking DDP you will receive knowledgeable information from professionally trained instructors regarding Drinking and Driving and Prevention. DDP is taught based on a curriculum called Prime for Life.

Is there anything I should bring with me to the 1st class?

YES. Please bring your conditional license with you to your first class. During your 1st class you will receive a form that lists your information, including but not limited to:

- Name
- Address
- Phone number(s)
- Motorist ID (Driver's License #)

It is important that you make sure the information on this form is correct and if anything changes at ANYTIME, you MUST inform the Director, Christie Speciale, at the number listed on the back of this brochure.

"Think Before You Drink"

What are the advantages of attending DDP?

Most motorists that sign up for DDP are issued a conditional license. Also, after completing the program, most motorists are able to immediately recover their full driving privileges.

What is a Conditional License?

A conditional license is a restricted drivers license. Eligible motorists will receive a conditional license while completing DDP. A conditional license allows the motorist to drive to and from:

- Work
- School & college
- DDP
- Evaluation/treatment
- Documented medical appointments
- Court/probation
- Child's daycare
- For 3-hour period of "personal" time once a week.

Am I eligible for DDP?

If you have been convicted of a DWI/DUI or related offense, you are most likely eligible. Call or visit the local DMV to find out if you are eligible.

How do I sign up for DDP?

After being convicted of DWI/DWAI, or DUI visit the local Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to sign up for DDP.

When are classes held?

Classes are typically held on Monday evenings from 6:00p-8:30p. If there is a holiday that is acknowledged by DDP, the Monday class will most likely fall on the next day (Tuesday). You will be informed if any of your classes fall on another day of the week.

What are the costs of DDP?

The DMV fee to sign up for the program is \$75. You will have to pay this amount when you visit the DMV. The DDP fee is \$225 and must be paid by WEEK 4 of DDP.

Where do I pay the DDP fee?

You can send payment to the address listed on the back of this brochure, please do NOT send cash in the mail.
(Instructor will not accept payments)

What forms of payment are accepted??

Cash, Check, or Money Order made payable to *Trinity of Chemung County*

Are there any tests?

Yes. During the 1st session, all participants are screened for a possible alcohol and/or drug abuse problem. Each participant fills out a self-test concerning his/her current alcohol and drug use. Based on the test results, or other criteria, you may be referred for a substance abuse evaluation.

Am I allowed to miss any classes?

NO! You must attend every class throughout the 7 weeks. If an absolute emergency arises, you MUST contact the Director PRIOR to class.

Is there anything else I should know?
